Fellow Anglers:

First and foremost, a big THANK YOU to Joe and Kathleen Vitelli for hosting our Holiday Party this year. Those attending were certainly well-fed and hydrated, and there was holiday cheer in abundance.

Your Board and Officers are expecting a busy year for OPTU in 2013. Joe Vitelli is in the early planning stages for at least two OPTU-hosted group fishing outings like we did years ago. By the time the February newsletter is published we will have an alternate meeting place, although the time and date will remain the same.

YOUTH ACTIVITY REPORT

Trout in the Classroom

On Wednesday, December 5th, Joe Fagan traveled with Doug Thornburg of the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AGFD) to pick up eyed eggs of Rainbow Trout from the Tonto Fish Hatchery to the NE of Payson. The AGFD hatchery purchased about 50,000 triploid eggs from a private vendor in Utah. We got 103 of the sterilized eggs for the TIC trout tank at Desert Sky Country Day School.

The eggs have started hatching already. The baby trout after hatching are called alevin. They still have a yolk sac for food as they swim around. They are kept in an egg-basket so that eggs that die can easily be removed from the aquarium. The basket will be lowered into the water to allow the alevins to swim out of the basket as they get older and use up the yolk. The fish are called fry when they have used up their yolk. When the yolk is used up, the fry will need to feed. We supply finely ground dried fish for the fry to eat.



Children must be careful not to over feed the fry. Uneaten food becomes rotten dead fish that produce toxic nitrogenous waste. The students will siphon/vacuum out the waste from the bottom of the tank.

Volunteer for helping to teach fishing

As a Sport Fishing Educator for the AGFD, Joe Fagan is inviting members to help teach 25 Apache students at Mt. Turnbull Academy (high school) in Bylas, Arizona. He would like 3 – 5 volunteers to assist teaching bait-fishing in February. In April, Joe would like 5 – 10 volunteers to assist teaching the same high-school students fly-tying and fly-fishing.

Joe has arranged for volunteers to stay at a Cluff Ranch Bunk House on both occasions. Each month the days of the week for the Fishing Programs are the same: arrive on a Tuesday, teach at the school in the morning of a Wednesday, and depart after morning Field Instruction at Cluff Ranch Pond. Dates are for bait-fishing, February 26, 27, and 28. Dates are for Fly-tying and -fishing, April 2, 3, & 4. A side benefit for

volunteers is to go up to near-by Frye Mesa Reservoir to fish for trout, including the endangered Gila Trout. Cluff Ranch pond can be fished too. It would best be fished from float tube or pontoon. (Students will fish from shore at the Cluff Ranch Pond.)

Upcoming Fishing Trips and Outings Reports

We are happy to report that we can add three more fly fishermen to the small fraternity who can boast of catching a Gila Trout. On December 3, 2012, members from OPTU, PHWFF and the San Pedro Club traveled to Frye Mesa Reservoir for a relaxing day of fishing.

The day was warm and sunny with a light breeze. Unlike previous trips where the dry flies ruled the water and caught the majority of the fish, this trip nymphs were the flies of the day. Congrats to Bruce from the San Pedro Fly Casters, Bob O'Brien from OPTU and Mario from PHWFF, who can now check off catching a Gila Trout from their fishing bucket lists.

Before we left Frye Mesa, Robin Marsett was able to do a leader's recon to the lower portion of Frye Creek which is located about one mile past the reservoir. He is happy to report that he saw large numbers of Gila Trout in that section of Frye Creek. The fish appeared healthy with some exceeding 11 inches in size. Robin is planning to return to Frye Creek to continue scouting other sections for Gila populations. It certainly appears the stocking program has been a huge success!! At this point in time, however, fishing is prohibited in Frye Creek. It is with great hope that when fishing is allowed in the future, there will be appropriate restrictions to keep the population healthy and growing.

The meeting was held at 6:00 p.m. at the Viscount Suites Hotel.

There was a brief discussion about the December Board meeting which according to the schedule would be held the day after Christmas. Steve will advise with regard to a possible different date.

General discussion about the projected 2013 budget. Steve wanted to confirm the \$4,000 budget set aside for 2013, which will help cover the cost of two main outings. A motion to accept the 2013 budget was made by Steve, seconded by Robin and accepted by the Board.

Kathleen reported on the upcoming holiday party which will be held at the Vitelli's home. She advised that receipts will be submitted to OPTU for reimbursement for the main dishes and party ware.

MEETING SPEAKERS

Steve indicated that he has arranged for Sally Petrie to speak at the January 2013 member meeting about her research and White Mountains project. In addition, Lisa from AZGFD will give an update on the Wallow fire and volunteer opportunities for 2013.

Steve has not yet confirmed speaker for February meeting, perhaps he can have Rick Weisberg do a presentation about fishing in Utah. There is no speaker arranged yet for March. Additionally, Steve has no meeting venues set up past January and will have to look at several options.

The Sierra Vista fishing club will hold their banquet on March 9, 2013. Discussion about purchasing tickets as an organization and in lieu of our member meeting, we will attend their banquet.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES

Joe Fagan reported on Trout in the Classroom and the participation of Desert Sky Charter School. On 12/5 Joe will pick up about 100 trout eggs from the hatchery and install at the school. They should hatch in a few weeks. Joe has been training several volunteers and TIC will run to the end of the school year.

Joe requested more participation from the membership with respect to several programs he will be conducting, specifically with the Apache Tribe and Turnbull Academy. The Turnbull academy project with be a bait fishing program which would involve classroom on February 27th and field trip to Frye Mesa on February 28th. The weekend will be held at the Cluff Ranch with arrival on February 26th.

In addition, he is conducting a program at Cluff Ranch from April 2nd to the 4th which will include fly tying and fishing. Joe has requested 10 volunteers and money from OPTU for food.

Joe expressed that OPTU should follow AZGFD's youth fishing program and have one of our own. This would be a way to get youth more involved in our organization.

PHWFF/CONSERVATION

Robin reported on Roseann's behalf that there is nothing new to report in the way of conservation except to say that she will be planning something for April or May 2013.

PHWFF will be going to Mt. Graham on 12/3/2012. Robin also reported that as the war in Afghanistan winds down, he expects less wounded vets in the WTU at Fort Huachuca. When they are in the transition unit, their focus is on getting well. Those that are not retired do not have as much free time to participate in Lie and Tie, etc.

OUTINGS

Joe V. reported that in the several Rose Canyon outings over the past month, participation has doubled and has included several PHWFF wounded vets. OPTU members will also participated in the 12/3 Grant Creek outing with PHWFF.

Joe has scheduled a joint outing with PHWFF to the X Diamond Ranch on 3/29/13 to 3/31/13. Joe will use approximately \$1500 from the OPTU outings budge to rent an 11 passenger van and pay for gas. The outing will include PHWFF members as well. Joe hopes that we can be offered a discount from Jim Click, who has been generous in the past with PHWFF. The cabin will cost approximately \$60.00 per night, per person, plus a stipen put up by each attendee for food. Joe suggests the OPTU pick up one dinner for attendees. The fishing will include Becker Lake, Silver Creek and water at the X Diamond.

NEW BUSINESS

Steve indicated that Vaughn had been in touch with the National TU organization with respect to OPTU's ability to charge an additional chapter membership fee, and with information on better ways to promote our chapter.
