BOARD MEMBERS ATTENDING

Meeting was held at SK Builders and was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mike announced that Arizona Trout Unlimited was searching for someone to fill the position of secretary/ treasurer should anyone be interested.

BANQUET

Dave reported that of the \$2,000 he had to spend on the auctions items, he had just under \$1,400 yet to spend and asked board members for suggestions.

Thus far he had acquired a number of auction items including several restaurant gift certificates, several 2day getaways including Big Horn River and Antler Ridge in Greer. Dave indicated that Cabela's will be making a donation. Several items have been donated from the Marsett's, a round of golf for four at La Paloma has been donated, and clothing from Jay. The Vitelli's will donate a wine and goodies basket.

The board discussed having shirts made with the OPTU logo and present them for sale at the banquet. Dave and Mike discussed their contacts to get this done. Jay confirmed that he has arranged for Weaver to conduct the auctions, and he also acquired a screen to be used for the slide presentations. The auction and bucket raffles will be located near the bar. Jay confirmed that in order to be cost effective, the dinner menu will be limited to chicken only.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES

No report as Joe Fagan was absent from meeting due to another commitment. Roseann indicated that she would be volunteering with the Girl Scouts and perhaps we could extend our fly tying to the girls as well. Mike suggested Roseann speak with Joe Fagan.

CONSERVATION REPORT

Roseann indicated that Trout Unlimited's clean-up day in scheduled for 4/21/12, but that would conflict with a PHWFF event. As an alternative, Roseann suggested this chapter conduct a clean-up/fishing day at Fry Mesa on 4/14/12.

Roseann had spoken to Clay Hernandez about this. He also indicated that there would be a volunteer cleanup of the Black River (White Mountains) in June. The Marsetts would be unavailable due to their Alaska trip.

Robin reported on a recent trip to Fry Mesa, there was some trash. Also, pallets are burned and the nails are left behind. There was also a request by Clay to check for NO FISHING signs up above the mesa and if needed, he will supply signs for posting.

OUTINGS REPORT

Joe V. reported that members participated in an outing at Sahaurita Lake earlier in January and a trip to Parker Canyon was scheduled for January 28th.

Joe indicated that he and Robin did a recon trip to Fry Mesa and that the Gila trout fishing was very active. Additionally, Rose Canyon Lake on Mount Lemmon has also been very active.

Joe reported that February outings would include a fishing trip to Rose Canyon on February 9th and Frye Mesa Reservoir on February 24th.

Robin added that FFF does issue a badge if you catch four species of trout, but the Gila trout was not included in this group. It was discussed that perhaps our chapter can offer something similar.

CHAPTER MEETINGS REPORT

Steve reminded members that the February member meeting presentation would be done by Ed Lawrence on fishing in Montana; the March meeting presentation would be done by Jack Dennis, who would do a fly tying segment and then two 45 minute presentations; and the April presentation would be done by Jerome Gallegos.

With respect to Jack's presentation, Eric of Dry Creek Outfitters offered to pick up half the cost if Jack would do the fly tying portion at his shop.

Steve reported that no speakers have been scheduled for the May and June meetings. Perhaps we could consider a presentation on Gila trout or fishing in other regions/states contiguous to Arizona. Robin indicated that he would talk to Jerome about doing a presentation on fishing the upper rivers in Colorado.

A discussion then took place with respect to suspending regular member meetings in July and August due to anticipated low attendance.

A suggestion to see if Dave Brown from British Columbia would be available for the May meeting before he leaves Tucson. In addition, fall topics could include a revisit by AZ Game/Fish with update on rehab from Wallow fire destruction.

PHWFF

Robin reported that weekly fly tying classes continue and that competition rod building has begun. PHWFF will participate jointly with OPTU in the Frye Mesa and Parker Canyon upcoming trips. There will also be a joint PHWFF/OPTU four day trip to the White Mountains from March 1-4, 2012, and a San Juan River trip on April 21st.

The September Durango, Colorado trip is on schedule. Additionally, Robin has three individuals going on a guided trip to Alaska, each of them will sponsor a wounded veteran on that trip. Healing Waters in Anchorage told Robin that since there is no fishing in winter, they will send two of their veterans on the San Juan trip and will offer exchange fishing in Anchorage for two PHWFF members.

Robin is working on getting an MOA signed by Desert Flycasters. With respect to participants from Davis-Monthan, Robin said that he has one participant from D-M.

WOMEN'S INITIATIVES

Nan indicated that she is planning to organize a second women's fly casting event in April or May. She would like to do a follow-up fishing for attendees at Canyon Creek shortly after the clinic so attendees can put what they learned to practical use.

Roseann reported that the National TU website is reorganizing and will give equal focus to fishing as well as conservation. This reorganization will also bring women in TU into focus and suggest have every state develop a women's initiative with subgroups based on regional TU chapters. Each regional chapter website would have sub groups such as women's initiatives, PHWFF, etc. There will also be fishing reports available throughout the country which can be accessed on website by entering a pertinent zip code. TU will finalize the new version by October 2012.

The new website will be blog focused and a beta version, or read-only version. As a regional group, Roseann would set up the web page and be the administrator. Roseann will keep the board updated.

A discussion then was presented by Kathleen regarding the inactivity of our OPTU facebook page and the upcoming changes coming to facebook which would archive non-active facebook group pages. Suggestions were made to discuss this with our facebook administrator Mark DeVries. Roseann suggested we should have more than one administrator on not only Facebook but the new TU blog pages. She suggested being an administrator along with Kathleen and Nan.

NO OLD BUSINESS

Mick discussed the AZ legislatures' handing out of game permits to politicians who then hand out as they see fit. Item was tabled on state level for further discussion. He reminded members that they can access information from the Arizona Council at <u>www.AZTU.org</u>. He also asked members where the AZ license plate postcards were placed so the council can follow-up and refill them periodically. Mick indicated that the AZTU council holds a conference in March/April on native trout up at Game and Fish in Phoenix.

Discussion was held regarding sending out reminder postcards next year about the banquet and it was agreed to do that next year along with two blast email reminders.

Discussion regarding acquiring OPTU letterhead with updated member information and taking the time to send our monthly speakers a thank you letter.

Mike indicated he would be on vacation from February 25 through March 17, 2012. The next Board meeting would be on February 22, 2012.
