

waters in the Four Corners area, hatch the best times to fish each of these perspective on these waters and his Colorado.


CONSERVATION NEWS


There will be two OPTU CleanUp days in 2012. The first will be April 14th at Frye Mesa Reservoir. The plan

FISH IN ALASKATHIS SEPTEMBER

Have you ever wanted to fish in Alaska? If so, consider joining John Murphy's annual trip there in September. Though designed as an educational meeting for physicians and pharmacists in addition to the fishing, OPTU members and their friends are welcome and have joined us in the past (and you don't have to join the education). Here are the details. A weeklong Lodge package will be from September 8 to 14 or 15 to 21, 2012. The rate for a single week will be \$3795 plus \$150 for a plane shuttle from the Kenai airport to Anchorage at the end of the stay (total of \$3945). This is approximately 10% off the usual price. For those who wish to come for more or less than one week, contact Great Alaska to determine the cost. Morning pick up in Anchorage for a scenic van ride to the Lodge will be at 7:45 am on September 8th or 15th and departure for the Kenai airport for return to Anchorage will be at 2:30 pm on the 14th or 21st. From a Fish Alaska Magazine article by guide JD Richey: To clean up rods and reels with lots of caked on crust, spray a little lemon pledge on the blanks and cork (and outside of a reel) and let sit for a few minutes. Then wipe it off with a dry rag. WD40 on a rag is good for the reel seat and guides. You can bring old rusted lures back to life using WD40. When that doesn't work, soak them overnight in diet cola.

FISHING REPORTS

A group of intrepid anglers headed to the "new" San Juan River last week for the 10th Annual OPTU fishing event. Though one of our crew had to fly up two days later due to a daughter who became ill 10 minutes before we left on Sunday, the week was the usual success. Our accommodations at the Octagon

were excellent and the food yummy (special thanks to Gary and Jeff for special concoctions). Several of the group spent time with guide Andy Kim and Gary Bedsworth did a float day. The weather was superb with cool mornings and reasonably moderate afternoons. No snow this year.

I think the fishing may have been the best ever for our trips and some of that was probably due to the changes made to the river upstream from the Texas Hole. Work was done to create a run in almost every section of the flats that did not previously have one. Large rocks were also added and certain of the previously connected sections were rerouted to increase flow to the runs. These runs all held dozens of fish and some of the anglers stayed in the same run for several hours each day catching trout in excellent condition. Everyone had their choice of nearly a dozen new runs and we took advantage. The only place I didn't have much luck was up by the dam, but imagine that will change over time as well. I caught two very nice fish there in a couple of hours though that would compare to a dozen in the same time frame elsewhere. The Kiddie Pool (KP) was fishing very well this year and I had one of my best days ever sight fishing on the flats just east of the KP one day when no one else chose to target the area. It seemed that if I could spot a fish I had a good chance of hooking it. Of course, in typical SJ style, the next day I had to work MUCH harder to get fish in the same area. The sun was really bright that day compared to a little overcast and breezy on the easier day, which may have explained the change somewhat. It doesn't seem likely that my skill level changed in a day.

In case you might be heading to the SJ in the near future, the top flies for our trip were redheads and blondes (red chironomids and Yong blondes). Jeff was catching quite a few on an olive colored flashback mayfly emerger pattern. He gave me some and I did well on them in the afternoon at Baetis Bend. Yong specials were also very productive. As always, when the fishing slows try a variety of tiny midge imitations.

The 11th annual trip will be the same week next year (March 10 to 15) and will be limited to nine individuals. I'll advertise for it later in the year but if you are interested shoot me an email. *The editor*.

A love of fly fishing, crackerjack brainstorming and substantial legwork led to the successful launch of Rio Salado Casting Club. Thanks to Woody Wilson, President, Lakeshore Music at Tempe Center for the Arts and Dr. Larry Allen, past president Arizona Flycasters Club, FFF Master Casting Instructor, and member of the American Casting Team, Rio Salado Casting Club will be a celebrated asset to Arizona's angling community. For the Grand Opening, Saturday, April 7th at 11 AM, Larry's arranged a special treat by inviting Steve Rajeff to pace us through the casting course at the kickoff event at Gilbert Municipal Court.

Steve Rajeff is among the most renowned casters and anglers in the world, with 37 American and 14 world casting championships to his name. Steve started in the sport as a youngster and never stopped. After guiding in Alaska and Wyoming, Steve settled in as rod designer for $G \cdot Loomis$, leaving time for him to pursue his passion, luckily both during working hours and days off. Rio Salado Casting Club (RSCC) is an American Casting Association member club. RSCC will host guest casters from around the country and regular monthly club events will include casting demos, discussions about equipment, casting tips and tournament style fly, spin and revolving spool casting to targets on the lake. Casting techniques, such as the double haul, innovative taper designs and early fly line advances were introduced by tournament casters. What a pleasure, to benefit from the experience of experts. Future events will be posted on the website.

Tournament casting is a test of skill between the individual caster and tricky targets. Clearly casting targets are round for a reason...they resemble the ring of a rise. Though not as tricky as fish, they're intended to improve our casting and angling skill. Come out and enjoy the experience, meet new friends, familiarize yourself with different equipment, or try out your own gear on the targets. RSCC membership information will be available on opening day.

There's convenient parking and nearby facilities, remember to apply your sunscreen and wear a hat - we're counting on typical Arizona sunshine. Bring along a folding camp chair so you're plenty comfortable and perhaps a cooler with snacks and drinks. It'll be one heck of an exciting day and just plain good fun with friends, old and new!

OPTU MEETING MINUTES - FEBRUARY 22, 2012

ATTENDEES

Board Meeting was held at SK Builders Office and was called to order at 6:05p.m.

BANQUET COMMITTEE REPORT

Banquet Committee members, Roseann Marsett, Kathleen Vitelli and Dave Combs met prior to this board meeting and prepared an assessment and recommendations report which was distributed to all board members.

The following are committee recommendations for the success of future banquets:

- •Roseann indicated that we the committee suggests we look to break even on the cost of the food and not focus on making a profit from this. It is suggested that we definitely need to change the venue with the mission of providing good food at a fair price at a nice location. Several venues will be looked at for the 2012 banquet including Ventana Canyon Resort and La Paloma resort.
- •With respect to the bucket raffles, we may want to call out the raffle winners vs. leaving the winning number at the bucket. It is agreed that calling the bucket raffle out loud, perhaps in several rounds, it makes for more fun and excitement for the participants.
- •The short speaker presentations of the last banquet seemed to go over well.
- •The committee highly recommends the Chapter have shirts, hats and patches available for purchase to the members at all meetings and the banquet. These items should be priced out. Dave Combs has a connection for shirts and a motion was made by Joe Vitelli and seconded by Kathleen Vitelli, with approval by all board members, to give Dave an allowance of \$500.00 to get the ball rolling on shirts and hats, which will then be brought back to the board for further approval on purchases.
- •It was also recommended that when new members join OPTU they should get a welcome letter from the President along with an OPTU patch.
- •Additionally, outstanding members should be recognized at the banquet for outstanding work in the Chapter. Perhaps more than one award should be given. Suggestions of giving a plaque or framed certificate.
- •Finally, it was recommended that more emphasis should be put on advertising the banquet. This can be achieved by preparing posters to be placed at key locations including Dry Creek Outfitters, Sportsman Warehouse, etc. Also taking advantage of local newspapers and radio.

Kathleen asked Mike Mehrer if there was a complete list or roster of all OPTU members. Mike indicated that it is available on the TU website in the Leaders Only section. Mike advised Kathleen that as secretary she now has access to this section and can obtain roster.
