Other waters have different varieties of cutthroat trout, as well as rainbows and browns. His program will look at 4 lakes and one stream within a short drive of the town of Boulder, UT.

FISH ALASKATHIS JUNE

Ever wanted to fish in Alaska? If so, consider joining my annual trip there next June. OPTU members and friends are most welcome. Fishing will be for King Salmon from boat, beach at the lodge, or in small rivers; Sockeye Salmon (one of the best fighting fish on a fly rod); halibut; grayling; rainbows; and dolly varden. After a day of guided fishing you can fish till midnight from the beach if you have the stamina. Cullen caught

a 70 lb King off the beach. A weeklong Lodge package from June 15 to 21, 2013 is \$3995 plus \$150 for a plane shuttle from the Kenai airport to Anchorage at the end of the stay (total of \$4145). Includes all room, board, happy hour, and daily guided activities. Note that I do not receive any portion of the payment - so its just an opportunity for getting together in Alaska with friends. FISHING REPORTS

I was at Parker Canyon yesterday fishing for trout with two of my grandsons. We caught 10 to 12 inch trout deep on powerbait and brought some home to eat. When I was cleaning them, I noticed that they were full of size 16 to 20 midge pupa of all colors: grey-black, mahogany, green, black, chocolate brown, etc. Most of them were shiny, so I expect disco midges, bead heads or flies ribbed with crystal flash would be in order. They were still viable and wriggling when I dumped them into a glass of water to get a better look. I'm going to try to get back out there soon with my fly rod to see what works, although they were in deep water that might be difficult to flyfish.

I don't think the bluegill, etc. have gotten started yet, but I'll try to get back into the upper arm the next time I go to check that out. *Jack Williams*

OPTU BOARD MINUTES

APRIL 3, 2013

Meeting was called to order at 5:25 p.m and was held at the Viscount Suites Hotel.

WOMEN'S INITIATIVES/CONSERVATION

Roseann reported that the upcoming women's fly casting clinic scheduled for the weekend of April 6, 2013 was almost full, two openings still available.

Frye Mesa Reservoir conservation outing will be held on Saturday, April 13th, and this will not be an overnight event as originally planned. The schedule is to meet at 9:00 or 10:00 a.m., conduct the cleanup and get some fishing time in for Gila Trout. AZGFD representatives will be on hand to collect data from fish that are caught at the reservoir. The second conservation event is planned for early May or possibly June at the West Fork to check the temperature loggers.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES

Joe Fagan reported on the details of the storage facility he was approved to rent to store his TIC equipment. He will get a second key which will be given to Steve. The unit will cost approximately \$43.00/month. Steve will be putting OPTU rods/reels and other equipment in the storage unit as well. Joe reported that we need to find a second school for Trout in the Classroom. It was suggested that he go through previous mailed responses. He indicated there will be little or no expenditures for the second school. Joe has several TU members trained to help. The current school, Desert Sky, which has had the program this year has about 20 fish left. Joe does not know if they are performing the appropriate testing.

There will be a boy scout merit badge for fly fishing this year which will coincide with the scouts camping on Mount Lemmon from July 8th through July 12th. Joe will need help from OPTU members to assist them in tying flies, catching two different types of fish and casting.

PHWFF

Robin indicated that as of January 2014, he will be stepping down from Project Healing Waters and will be looking for someone to take his place. As the wars have wound down, the WT unit at Fort Huachuca has been closed.

OUTINGS

Joe reported a successful White Mountains trip at the X-Diamond Ranch in Eager. Although the weather was quite chilly and extremely windy conditions were in place, all had a good time. The budget allotment was sufficient.

Joe indicated that he will be looking into the Utah trip in early November as previously approved the Board (\$2500). Vaughn indicated he would be up there in May. Joe suggested that he might want to help put this trip together. This trip will be limited to 10 attendees, with several slots for PHWFF members.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Steve reminded Board members that the Native Trout workshop will be held in Phoenix on April 18, 2013. Anyone wishing to attend must rsvp. Steve and Mick will be attending.

Steve has arranged a photo workshop for interested OPTU members with photographer, Alex Landeen on May 4, 2013. The cost of the workshop will be \$65pp. It will have a short classroom instruction, then a field trip to an outdoor location for picture taking and then a return to classroom for viewing and critique. A preliminary blast email will be sent out by Kathleen. The venue is still to be determined.
