
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

PROJECT HEALING WATERS FLY FISHING



Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing is undergoing some changes. Our focus in southern Arizona is shifting from active-duty troops to veterans, for whom we will continue to provide much-needed support.

Fort Huachuca was where we began the program here in southern Arizona and is where the great majority of our participants came from, including some that are with us still after separating from active service. With the drawdown of U.S. forces in combat operations the number of injured troops returning to Arizona has been greatly reduced, a goal we all looked forward to. As a result, the Warrior Transition Unit (WTU) at Fort Huachuca has been deactivated, thus the change from Active-duty troops to veterans.

Because I have been at it now for nearly five years and have done what I set out to do by assisting injured troops returning home it is time for me to step down.

Starting on January 1st the program will be led by Captain Chris Allen of Sierra Vista and Major Mario Bracamonte of Tucson. They started as participants in the program and have now become the leaders. Please give them your support as they continue the good work.

Alaska Fishing Report - September 20-26, 2013

Eric Loeffler and I headed for the Kenai September 19th. After 13 hours in the Phoenix airport due to broken plane we were transferred from Alaska Air to US Air. Alaska came through with a \$350 off coupon for our troubles but it definitely made for a long, long trip. We arrived in Anchorage at 1:30 am and took straight off for the Kenai Peninsula. After a great breakfast at the 24 hour open Caribou restaurant and purchase of supplies at Safeway, we headed on down to the Anchor River. We were able to check in at the Anchor River Inn at 8 am, dress up in our waders, and head to the river. Eric hooked and missed a few and I hooked and lost one before we headed to Deep Creek. The river was low and we didn't see or touch a fish. After walking up about a half mile we headed back to the car. The decisions was whether to go fishing or rest and we chose fishing. I managed to get 5 of 7 steelhead in the next two hours so a wonderful decision. Over the next five days Eric triumphed over his previous skunkings by steelhead and is now officially a steelheader. I had one bad day and the rest were generally good. All in all a nice trip. The food and bar at the Anchor River Inn were quite good and I would recommend the motel (\$70/night this late in the season). Has fridge and microwave and definitely comfortable enough. On a competitive note, I was able to stay ahead of Eric on the pool table, though we both had some pitiful games and some good ones. :-)
