Fellow Anglers:

Just a brief update on our two fundraising efforts:

Banquet ticket sales seem to be doing pretty well, so far. We have actual sales or commitments for about 40 tickets to date. YOUTH ACTIVITY REPORT

On Thursday September 19th a few OPTU members volunteered to assist with the Boy Scout's Adventure Program with their Powder Horn event. About 25 older (14 to 21 years old) Scouts, both male and female, took time to learn Fly-casting from Dan Malone and Steve Reiter. I taught them how to tie some simple fishing flies. My wife, Mary Welch, provided classes, bait, and fishing rods for fishing at Pena Blanca Lake (Only 15 sunfish were caught). The event provided other learning opportunities over 3 days to learn other outdoor skills like rock climbing, kayaking, leaving no trace to name a few.

Trout in the Classroom (TIC) will be done at Flowing Wells High School this school year. We will be working with agriculture students. They are already raising tilapia fish, but will work with a small, cold fishery in the classroom. Students wish to do fly-fishing training during the winter holidays, January 2 and 3. Classroom training would be in their classroom at Flowing Wells H. S. on the 2nd. Casting training and Fly-fishing for trout would be at Silverbell Lake on the 3rd. Three eleventh and twelfth grade young men have been teaching TIC to their agri-science classmates as an agricultural project this school year. They suggested the holiday dates to me saying that their classmates that really want to learn fly-fishing will be the ones that show up. I would hope OPTU members will mentor students one on one for the training. Contact Joe Fagan if you wish to help.

We are starting a second trout aquarium for another TIC program at another school with 4th grade students at Fruchthendler Elementary School on the NE side of Tucson.

Our chiller that we have been using and its water pump have broken after 6 years of use. We may have the chiller repaired to use as an emergency stand-by for two working chillers. We will have to purchase a new chiller (The rainbow trout eggs and fry must be kept at a cool temperature of 53 degrees Fahrenheit). Our new Fruchthendler Elementary School will need the new chiller, perhaps using the repaired old one until we can get it replaced with a new one. Chillers are expensive, costing a little more than \$700 each.

We will need active participation in TIC with OPTU volunteers if we wish to expand TIC to other schools in Tucson. I will not be able to do the work alone as we add more schools. Once TIC "catches on" in

Tucson, we may expect schools to purchase their own equipment and provide expertise help assisting beginning teachers in TIC. See the link if you want more information about national Trout in the Classroom. http://www.troutintheclassroom.org/

For Boy Scouts, I remain a representative for OPTU on the Camping Committee for the Catalina Council. We are still interested in involvement with Boy and Cub Scouts learning to fish. But we will need to have more involvement of OPTU members if we want to get youth involved with OPTU. I would like to have an OPTU representative available to teach Fly-Fishing Merit Badge requirements on most days of 4 weeks of summer camps up at Camp Lawton this summer. Contact me if you are willing to help out this summer up in the cool of the Catalina Mountains. We can have a venue to teach up there, tying flies of our own if we are not busy with Boy Scouts.

Here's the link to youth oriented activities done by other chapters of OPTU. We ought to be able to do some of them similarly. Thanks in advance for taking the time to look over the information in the link. Let me know if there are any that are appealing to you to work with me to get started in our chapter. I'd like the women in OPTU to begin sharing with Girl Scouts. PROJECT HEALING WATERS WHITE MOUNTAIN TRIP SEPTEMBER 27 - OCT. 2, 2013

Project Healing Waters just completed a three day fishing trip to Aker Lake, X-Diamond Ranch and Silver Creek in the White Mountains of Arizona.

DAY ONE -- AKER LAKE

Aker Lake is located in the mountains southwest of Alpine in the Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest. The day was sunny and clear with light winds. Although the lake is small in size, it holds a large population of Graylings....yes Graylings in Arizona, not to mention Apache trout. Upon arrival, we could see fish rising to feed from the surface, an encouraging sign for successful fishing. The veterans used both dry flies and nymphs both of which were enticing the fish. After five hours of fishing over 25 grayling were caught along with one nice Apache trout. A great lakeside lunch was enjoyed as were many cigars!

DAY TWO -- X-DIAMOND RANCH

We were generously permitted access to the X-Diamond waters in the South Fork Canyon on the Little Colorado River near the Village of Greer. Fishing started on the stocked trout ponds which proved to be a bit slow due to muddy conditions caused by earlier rains.

A command decision was made to move to the area of the Little Colorado which runs through the ranch. The water flow was perfect and the trout were biting. Dry fly fishing proved to be a little slow so the anglers switched to bead head nymphs. There wasn't a pool on the river that failed to yield two or three trout. Their size ranged from 7 to 14 inches, both Browns and Rainbows!

DAY THREE -- SILVER CREEK

Silver Creek is a true spring creek which is heavily stocked with Rainbow and Apache trout, sizes ranging upwards of 30 inches. We arrived on opening day of the upper catch and release section of the creek. Our friends from AZ Game and Fish made it a very special day for our veterans group as well as other Project Healing Waters groups from throughout Arizona. We all had our own section of the creek to fish. Additionally, the Grand Canyon Council of Boy Scouts of Arizona provided breakfast and lunch and a local band provided some great music. As expected on an opening day, the bite was on! The fish were very aggressive and needless to say the trout were large. The Apache trout caught ranged in size between 14 to 18 inches and the Rainbow trout ranged from 16 to 24 inches.

We have attached some pictures of the days catch. A more complete photo log has been posted to the PHWFF and OPTU Facebook page.

I would like to congratulate a job well done in organizing and running this trip to Mario Bracamonte,

Major (RET.), who will be the new director of the Tucson PHWFF chapter and will share responsibilities with Captain Chris Allen of the Fort Huachuca chapter. I would be remiss not to mention Robin Marsett who started the local PHWFF chapter five years ago dedicating thousands of hours of his own time to make this program a success.

FISHING REPORTS

OPTU Fly-Fishing Report - Circleville, Utah - September, 2013 Circle Valley Anglers; Owner: Emmett Doane

Four years ago, long-time OPTU member Harry Heimann met six women at Ft. Lowell Park. Each was holding a \$50 fly rod. His challenge: Teach them the basics of the sport of flyfishing. Today, all six women are enthusiastic fly fishers and all are OPTU members.

At the end of September, two of the group, Mary Frances Ruddick and Kathleen Sullivan travelled to Circleville, Utah to join owner Emmett Doane at Circle Valley Anglers. Emmett had been a guest speaker at an OPTU meeting last winter. His presentation, the beauty of the area, and the allure of several blue-ribbon streams, triggered immediate interest.

Guide Lenny introduced them to a variety of streams at different altitudes from mountains to meadows. They fished six pristine streams: Beaver Creek, Merchant's Creek, Asay Creek, Mammoth Creek, Panguitch Creek, Bunker Creek and their favorite - Kingston Canyon.

Fish Caught: Cutthroat; Bonneville Cutthroat; Rainbows and Rocky Mountain Whites. Used hopper/dropper patterns: Wooly Buggers (purple); Prince Nymphs; Pheasant Tail flashbacks, Hares Ears, etc. The purple Woolys were a big hit.

Circle Valley Anglers has a comfortable lodge with full kitchen and their guided trips are set up for singles, groups or families. Their guides are adept from beginners to advanced. The restaurant across the street serves good meals. There is a motel attached to the restaurant that can easily accommodate over-flow. Hiking at Bryce and Zion is nearby is a real bonus.

BOARD MEETING MINUTES

OCTOBER 2, 2013

Meeting was held at Viscount Suites Hotel and was called to order at 5:45 p.m..

Steve discussed the Helios rod/reel package raffle fundraiser in which tickets will be \$20 each or three for \$50. A maximum of 300 tickets will be sold and the final drawing will be at the OPTU March 2014 banquet. Steve had the rod/reel package available for the meeting as well as tickets. Tickets will also be sold at Dry Creek outfitters. Steve will also get info out to administrator of AZfly and tie web blog for posting. Additionally, Steve indicated Eric can take credit cards for purchase of raffle tickets as long as OPTU pays his 3% fee; all agreed. Some discussion continued about other venues to sell tickets at in Tucson such as sporting events or in conjunction with PHWFF booths which will now be handled by Mario Bracamonte in the wake of Robin stepping down at the end of the year. Robin will reach out to Mario.

BANQUET UPDATE

Dave indicated he is working on the solicitation of donations for the banquet. He indicated that Circle Valley anglers wiling to donate lodging for four people for two nights. He also reached out to San Pedro Fly Casters for fundraising sources. Dave feels, as do other board members, that we should not limit our banquet items to being related to fishing. Dave has also reached out to John Osborne of Goldberg and Osborne for a sponsorship donation and John is considering it.

Kathleen is meeting with Tanque Verde Ranch within next week to square away menu, venue setup, etc., for banquet. Discussion about giving full table purchases a free ticket, all agreed.

OUTINGS

Joe Vitelli discussed the previously dedicated money of \$2,500 which was to be used for a late October/early November OPTU sponsored fishing trip along with PHWFF. He had planned a Utah trip, however, after talking to Circle Valley outfitters, a decision was made not to do the trip as fishing conditions would not be that great. Joe asked that the money be put aside for a trip in the spring.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES

Joe Fagan indicated that the water pump is not working and has to be fixed or replaced. Will advise the board. He stated that a second school is started in Northeast Tucson. Joe may need back up chiller in the event the one he has breaks. He also needs to be reimbursed for the storage fees he pays for Youth activities equipment. With respect to the storage facility, Steve indicated he has OPTU items that need to be stored. A suggestion was made to allow PHWFF use some of our equipment if the need arises.

OTHER BUSINESS

A question was raised as to having an OPTU holiday party....last year's party was at the Vitelli's and the year before at the Marsetts. It was eventually agreed that in light of the work that needs to be done for upcoming banquet, we would forego a party and have a regular meeting/social get together in December with no speaker.

The 2014 budget discussion was tabled for now. The November OPTU meeting speaker will be Robin Marsett with a presentation on PHWFF's trip to Alaska in August. Meeting was adjourned at 6:35 p.m.
