PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings, Fellow OPTU'ers

Our next Chapter meeting on Wednesday, December 2, will be the first time in a while we have scheduled a meeting specifically for the purpose of meeting with members of the Chapter for business only. There will be no speaker or presentation other than Officers and Board members talking about various aspects of the Chapter and holding an election.

Going back a number of years, the "annual membership meeting and election of Officers" was folded in with a Christmas pot luck dinner and party at the home of one of the members. Meeting was held at the Viscount Suites Hotel and called to order at 5:00 p.m..

Discussion was held about non-officer Board positions of which there are no openings. Additionally, non-officer Board of Directors was agreed by unanimous vote.

October meeting minutes were moved to acceptance and unanimous.

Treasurer's Report

Roseann confirmed that copy of overview statement sent to Board members which included a \$5,000 transfer of funds to checking account.

Roseann indicated that TU National reported we are in compliance and TU will have final decision on new financial policy. Also, electronic signatures are acceptable. All financial statements including Schwab account can be accessed on line by Board members.

<u>Grants</u>

Roseann reported that OPTU can only award grant money to 501(c)(3) organizations. Once the grant money is awarded the grantee is not required to report on how the money is spent, but will be asked to voluntarily do this per OPTU request. Grant oversight committee will be overseen by Robin Marsett with the following members sitting on same: Joe Fagan, Scott Koktavy, Robin Marsett and two openings to be filled for a total of five members. It was suggested that one of the openings be filled by a representative from AZGFD.

Banquet - 2016

Kathleen reported on current status of ticket sales. Tickets are available at our meetings, at Dry Creek or from any of the Board members. Steve will reach out for San Pedro Fly Fishermen as to their interest in purchasing tickets.

Elections

Two Board Member seats are open, Vice President and Secretary. There were no nominations as a result of the blast email sent to members prior to this meeting. The nominations will be closed at the end of the member meeting immediately following the Board meeting.

The Board nominated Paul Olsen for Vice-President and he will be one of the nominees.

Conservation

Robin reported that a tentative trip to Grant Creek was scheduled for 11/16 to install temperature loggers and a future trip to Frye Creek as well to assess how many loggers will be installed. AZGFD may install one logger in Lemon Creek. Robin also reported that 1,000 Gila Trout were stocked at Oak Creek for recreational purposes, not for habitat restoration.
