I sincerely hope all of you had a safe and merry Christmas, and that your New Year will be happy and healthy.


Our first order of business for this New Year is a successful fundraising banquet on March 5th at the Tanque Verde Guest Ranch. The Board and Officers have based the OPTU budget on raising enough money at the 2016 banquet to fund the Chapter day-to-day activities for the next two years. Going off our expenses for the last couple of years, we need to raise at least \$16,000 to continue at our same level of activity until our next banquet in 2018. We very much need your attendance and participation to reach this goal.

CONSERVATION

TROUT IN THE CLASSROOM at Santa Rita HS:

Josh Ruddick reports that all of the "replacement trout eggs" have hatched; only a couple have been lost to date. There are 5 fish remaining from the original allotment.

TIC at Agua Caliente Elementary:

Svea Anderson reports that there about 70 fish surviving to date. Her students (4th grade) are doing all the water chemistry testing and record keeping and doing a very good job at it. Her class recently had a visit from the Mayor of Tucson, Jonathan Rothschild. He noticed the fish in the tank and commented on how small they were. The students told him they started out as eggs in the tank, then explained the TIC program to him. He was reportedly most impressed.

TIC at Flowing Wells:

The TIC teacher, Michelle Ferranti, has been out of town for an extended time due to an illness in her husband's family. Her students are apparently doing the TIC program independently from her guidance. I have repeated requested a program update, and have been promised same. Nothing has been received yet. I have no other contacts at the school, and I am sure the school won't release the students names or phone numbers to me. I can only conclude that "no news is good news".

All schools are now on their Christmas break. I know that both Josh and Svea have made arrangements to either visit the fish tank or have a trusted aide do so for the duration. I hope that Ms. Ferranti has been in touch with her students and has made similar arrangements.
