PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings, Fellow OPTU'ers

What a great time of the year to get outside! Days, for the most part, are sunny and mild, perfect weather for hiking, biking, gardening, fishing, or whatever moves you.

In mid-January a number of our members along with PHWFF troops had the opportunity to sample the newly-opened Frye Creek for Gila Trout. Some nice fish in the 12"-14" range, and many more in the 6"-8", were caught and released. Overnight accommodations were at the Cluff Ranch bunkhouses, with OPTU providing breakfasts and dinners for participants. The Cluff Ranch ponds provided an additional fishing opportunity, and lots of stocked trout and sunfish were caught and returned to the water. If you plan to go to Frye Creek, you should expect to make it an all-day trip. Transportation each way is at least two hours, probably more; and the hike to fishable water is at least 30-45 minutes to the lower reaches, and maybe an hour to the upper reaches of the creek. The creek will only be open to catch and release fishing until March 1, then will close to all fishing until next fall.





If Frye Creek is a bit too much of a challenge, try the urban lakes. They are stocked with trout every 2 weeks (the stocking schedule is posted on the AZGFD web site, www.azgfd.gov), and always have a population of sunfish. Urban lakes are a great place to practice your casting with that new rod you got for Christmas (you did get a new

rod, didn't you?) or to try out that newly-created fly pattern. Reports are that Kennedy Lake and Sahuarita Lake offer the best chance at catching something. There are apparently some water quality issues at Lakeside, and I haven't heard any reports from Silverbell. If you try out any of these waters, please consider posting a brief fishing report on our web site, http://oldpueblo.tu.org.

I am happy to announce that we will be holding a fundraising raffle between now and May that I think will be of wide interest to the membership. The winner will receive two nights lodging at the X-Diamond Ranch and one day of guided fishing for one or two anglers with Cinda Howard of FlyFish Arizona, either on the South Fork of the Little Colorado at the X-Diamond, or on any water in the White Mountains including on the WMAT reservation, where Cinda guides. This package, if purchased, would retail for over \$700. Tickets will be only \$10 each or 3 for \$25, and a maximum of 250 tickets will be sold. The drawing will be at the May 6th General Meeting. Cinda will be our speaker that month, and will draw the winning ticket. Raffle tickets can be purchased at the February, March, April, and May meetings (or until all the tickets are sold), at Dry Creek Outfitters, or through our web site. You can also contact any me directly (e-mail sreiter4@cox.net), let me know how many tickets you want and how I can get them to you. (The "small print": No meals are provided except for lunch on the guided trip. Cabins are furnished with fully outfitted kitchens so you can provide your own hot or cold meals as needed. Meeting was brought to order at 5:05 p.m.

Steve reported that Board member, Scott Koktavy's daughter passed away on 12/25/2014 and a memorial fund was set up in her name. Steve motioned that OPTU make a donation to same in the amount of \$100.00, seconded by Joe Vitelli.

Steve confirmed that Roseann Marsett would be stepping into the position of OPTU Treasurer to replace Cathy Koktavy. Roseann discussed the actual current organization funds and the project budget for 2015.

2016 BANQUET

A Banquet committee was suggested and the following members will take up the duties of preparing for the banquet: Dave Combs, Kathleen Vitelli and Steve.

Dave Combs indicated that he has a friend, Chris who is now working at Tanque Verde Ranch, the location of our 2014 budget. A discussion about having the banquet at TVR in 2016 resulted in members agreeing we should use this venue again. However, it was agreed that we should perhaps check other venues. Bryan Eto indicated that he would check with Hacienda Del Sol.

FUND RAISING FOR 2015

Steve reported that our raffle would be a 2 night trip to the X-Diamond Ranch and one day of guided fishing with Cinda Howard for two people. The cost to OPTU for this trip would be approximately \$605.00. The raffle will run until the May

2015 OPTU meeting. Cinda Howard will be our guest speaker and will draw the winner. It was agreed that tickets would see for \$10.00 each, 3 for \$25.00. Goal is to sell minimum of 200. Cinda will provide certificate to winner and will coordinate with that person regarding dates and cabin availabilities. Dave Combs suggested that we suspend bucket raffles at the member meetings until the completion of this fundraiser.

The Board reviewed the TU print shop and what it offers in the way of posters, tickets, flyers, etc. Samples were provided for the Board's review and it was agreed they were very professional. Robin reported on fishing Frye Creek indicating that the fishing was not good with only one 12" brought to hand. The pool below the falls was high and no activity seen. There was also some mono filament line found which may indicate poaching. The OPTU signs will be installed during the Cluff Ranch trip which identifies the species. Robin will also be the second OPTU delegate to the State Council.

OUTINGS

Joe V. indicated that the upcoming trip to Cluff Ranch was full and OPTU would be providing the food and housing supplied by Forestry.

Joe F. reported that the fish tank at Flowing Wells has been leaking and was moved to another room. He indicated that Hector Ponce De Leon has volunteered to help him.

Roseann advised the Board that TU National will again be offering free membership for women this spring.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:35 p.m..
