PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings, Fellow OPTU'ers

Next year at this time, my term of office as President will essentially be over. I have served for 3 years so far, and I am limited to a maximum of 4 years (two 2-year terms) by both the Chapter and National bylaws. In addition to President, next year's ballot will also include Treasurer and Secretary; the Vice President will be voted on at this year's Annual Membership Meeting in December. Are you, or do you know someone, who is qualified and willing to be our Vice President? According to our bylaws, any member in good standing can submit his/her name, or the name of another member in good standing, to the Nominating Committee for consideration. Please send your nominations to mail@oldpueblotu.org, subject line Officer Nomination. Officers serve a 2-year term, and may be re-elected to one additional 2-year term. Duties of each office are spelled out in the bylaws, posted on our web site here: http://oldpueblo.tu.org/sites/default/files/OPTU_Bylaws_Aug2015.pdf.

Unlike Chapter officers, there is no annual election for participation on the Board of Directors. A Board member must be a member of TU in good standing, commit to a 3-year term, and participate in at least 50% of the Board Meetings each year. Again, the duties of the BOD members are spelled out in the bylaws. If you would like to participate on the Board, please send an e-mail (address above). If you are unsure, you can attend any of our Board meetings; they are always open to the membership, but you will not be able to vote on Board business. New BOD members are elected by the existing Board members.





OPTU, like all other TU Chapters, is an all-volunteer organization. Nobody is getting paid to serve as either an officer or a board member. We serve because we believe in the mission of TU. Realizing TU's goals require both direct action – "boots on the ground" - and indirect action by participating in the Chapter leadership, writing letters, e-mails, and making phone calls to individuals and groups at the local, state, and national levels to try to influence legislation in favor of TU's mission of "conservation, protection, and restoration of coldwater fisheries and their watersheds." In the coming years we will have the additional opportunity to influence coldwater conservation in Arizona by issuing grants from the Evitts Conservation Fund to those who submit grant applications for qualified projects. This will also be a duty of the Chapter leadership. If you have ever considered participation in your Chapter at a higher level, please don't wait. There is never going to be a better time than NOW!

Our speaker for November is John Marvin, a member of the San Pedro Fly Casters, who recently returned from 15 days of fishing on the Kenai Peninsula in Alaska. John promises lots of pictures of large fish as well as of spectacular scenery. PROJECT HEALING WATERS FLY FISHING



In July PHWFF was hosted by Jim Click at his Rocking S Ranch in the Teton Valley in Idaho. Accommodations were superb with participants housed at both the main house and the guesthouse. The main house was located in a U shaped portion of the Teton River with fishing just 50 feet from the front porch. Mr. Click graciously provided for guides and drift boat for the duration of our stay. Soldiers fished the Teton River and multiple sections and forks of the Snake River. A prize was awarded to the soldier who caught the largest fish with an equal amount going to the guide.

For those who were interested, a tour of vintage aircraft at a local airport was provided. With a tour of the hangers and hands on tours of aircraft including a WWII Corsair, Korean War era Migs, a Saber Jet, Vietnam Era Jets and many others. The up-close sound of an eighteen cylinder Corsair was unforgettable.

In July we fished the Tangle River, a 16-mile (26 km) long chain of lakes connected by streams in the Denali Range in Alaska forming the headwaters of the Delta River. The lakes and streams support many species of fish, including Lake Trout and Artic Grayling. The area around the lakes consists mostly of tundra due to the high elevation 2,864 feet.

The last major trip of the year visited Orca Adventure Lodge in Cordova, Alaska. Participants took the ferry across Prince William Sound from Whittier, Alaska to Cordova, Alaska. Fished all day Tuesday on Eyak River and caught Silver Salmon, Dolly Varden. Fishing then moved to Prince William Sound, which produced Halibut, Cod, Yellow eye and Rockfish; Thursday fished the Eyak River for Silvers and Cabin Lake for Coastal Cutthroats. Friday weather prevented fishing and provided an opportunity to explore the Sheridan Glacier.
