UPCOMING FISHING TRIPS AND MEMBER OUTINGS

San Juan 2018

The 16th Annual OPTU San Juan fishing trip will be sometime in 2018. Keep an eye on the newsletter for details.

Cluff Ranch

OPTU is sponsoring a fly fishing trip and conservation day at Cluff Ranch. The bunkhouses and camping will be available to us from Friday 24 March to Sunday 26 March. If women attend, we will hold one of the two bunkhouses aside for their exclusive use. Breakfast and dinner will be provided by OPTU on the 25th, Breakfast will be provided by OPTU on the 26th, and lunch makings will be available so people can make their own on the 25th and 26th. There will be stocked trout in Cluff pond, there should be stocked Gila Trout in Frey Mesa Reservoir, there will be wild Gila Trout in Frey Creek which is open to fishing from 1 Oct to 31 March. Grant Creek has wild Apache trout and is about a 45-minute drive from Cluff Ranch. It is not necessary to stay all three days. If you want to come up for only one night or even one day that is OK. FISHING REPORTS

Six folks headed out to the 15th OPTU trip to the San Juan River. Though the river was often murky due to lake turnover, the fishing was quite good. The smallest fish I caught was 12 inches and the next smallest probably 18". I had several in the 20 to 22" range and almost all fish were not damaged. PROJECT HEALING WATERS

The group is off to a fantastic start for the 2017-fishing season!

On February 7 -9, 20 of our disabled veterans and volunteers, along with several participants from the Las Cruces and Phoenix Chapters, headed to Silver Creek for 3 days of fishing.

We were not disappointed – all of the Rainbow Trout caught were 20 inches or above with quite an active 3 days of fishing. The majority of the fish were caught on leeches, bead head nymphs and midges.

On the third day of fishing, the weather turned warm with a rise of 6 inches in the water level from runoff, which caused muddy water conditions. A number of participants switched to large black leeches, which turned out to be quite successful. I am able to report that all had a wonderful time, not only fishing, but also were able to share their stories and experiences. All were able to take with them many memories and photos of their catches.

We would like to thank Ken McGowan of Arizona Game and Fish, Director of the Silver Creek Hatchery, for accommodating our group and opening the road so our members could park near the stream.
