TROUT IN THE CLASSROOM

TIC in Southern Arizona is pretty much on life support. The participating schools have only a few fish remaining of the initial 100 trout eggs delivered in October. Phoenix schools are not faring much better. There has been a lot of head scratching among the instructors and volunteers statewide about the cause of the die-offs. In virtually all cases, water chemistry tests have been good, chillers, aerators, and filters have been working properly. With so few fish remaining there is not a very good chance of homing in on the root cause of the problem. However, the teachers and students are continuing with daily testing and record keeping with hopes to end the school year with at least a couple of fish surviving.

For January's session Joe Fagan showed how to tie a "Wet Muddler" and "Cone-Headed Zuddler" patterns.

For the **February 21**st session, Gilbert Castillo will show how to tie the "**Peacock Lady**" and "**Reservoir Whore**" patterns.


Space is limited so show up on time to get a place to tie flies with us. OPTU members and friends are welcome to participate.
